Inaugural Pope Saint John Paul II Lecture

April 22, 2015 at the Dominican House of Studies

The Pontifical Faculty of the Immaculate Conception (PFIC) and the Washington, D.C., Chapter of the Friends of John Paul II Foundation co-sponsored the Inaugural Pope Saint John Paul II lecture. The speaker was Archbishop J. Augustine DiNoia, O.P., a member of the Dominican Order, who is a noted theologian and prominent member of the Roman Curia. On September 21, 2013, Pope Francis appointed him Assistant (Adjunct) Secretary of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith. His previous position in the Curia was Vice President of the Pontifical Commission Ecclesia Dei.

Archbishop DiNoia considers Saint John Paul II to be the Pope who "will undoubtedly come to be regarded as one of the most important Popes in the history of Christendom" and who "has permanently altered the agenda for the dialogue between the Catholic faith and modern culture." The lecture attracted a broad audience (275 persons), which included seminarians, university students, professors, and lay professionals. Special guests among the audience were Archbishop Carlo Maria Vigano, Apostolic Nuncio to the United States, and John Garvey, President of The Catholic University of America. The gathering provided insight into the wisdom and teaching of Pope Saint John Paul II and promoted his legacy.

The presentation started with a comparison between Christian and Secular Humanism. Christians believe that we can be good humanists only because God helps us learn morality and guides our ethical thinking. Secular

Our Chapter has been extremely busy since the beginning of the year as we focus our attention on new and creative ways to convey our message about Saint John Paul II. Some of our ideas started several years ago with the development of the Educational Legacy programs in the Diocesan schools of the Metropolitan Washington, DC area. Our Chapter's brochure was updated and reprinted, two pamphlets about Saint John Paul II had been developed ('Interesting Facts' and 'Relics of Saint John Paul II'), a special Saint John Paul II book mark and several other items. A new Saint John Paul II Legacy Art Contest was introduced and conducted earlier this year in the Diocese and many schools, teachers and students participated. The Art Contest was extremely successful and captured the attention of young students about the life and legacy of this great Saint John Paul II.

We have exciting news to share with you. Our Chapter has taken another giant step forward in perpetuating the great legacy of Saint John Paul II. We co-sponsored a Pope Saint John Paul II Lecture on April 22, 2015 with the Pontifical Faculty of the Immaculate Conception. This inaugural lecture was held at the Dominican House of Studies in Washington, DC located across the street from the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. Our speaker was the Most Reverend Archbishop J. Augustine DiNoia, O.P., Adjunct Secretary of the Congregation of the Doctrine of the Faith. Over 275 people attended and were of all ages and backgrounds. We believe our future lies here! We will strengthen our efforts to perpetuate Saint John Paul II's inspiring and brilliant legacy by combining our efforts with prominent and recognizable organizations like the Pontifical Faculty of the Immaculate Conception. Currently, we are preparing a formal Endowment Agreement that will unite our two organizations in this endeavor. The officers and directors will be asked to vote on the Endowment Agreement at our June Meeting.

The Metropolitan Washington, DC Chapter has reached another milestone! We will celebrate the 30th Anniversary of our Chapter that was founded and accredited within the Washington Archdiocese in the fall of 1985. Walter Zachariasiewicz was the driving force that established this Chapter and over the years he has continued to be an active member. We are now one of forty-seven chapters around the World and surely there will be more in the future.

To celebrate our Chapter's 30th Anniversary, we will hold our annual Wadowice-on-the-Potomac event on Sunday, October 18, 2015 at 2:00 pm and the unveiling of a Bust of Saint John Paul II. This prestigious event will be held at The Catholic University of America. Because of a very generous donation by past members, Carl and Jean Sharek, our Chapter is able to donate a beautifully sculptured Bust of Saint John Paul II to Catholic University of America. humanism leaves divinity and religion out of humanism entirely. It bases the humanist life and its ethical principles on reason alone.

Subsequently, Archbishop DiNoia gave highlights from four Encyclicals written by Pope John Paul II, which are concerned with Christian Humanism. He touched upon the results from Vatican II because Saint John Paul II, known then as Archbishop Karol Wojtyla of Krakow, Poland, played a very important role in the Second Vatican Council.

The first encyclical discussed was *Redemptor Hominis* (1979), written shortly after Cardinal Karol Wojtyla became Pope. It provides an outline of the mission of his pontificate. Archbishop DiNoia pointed out that Saint John Paul II stressed that Christ is the center of creation and of history and redeemed all humankind. From this follows the need of the Church to draw all men to Christ, a task which can be furthered by ecumenism.

Archbishop DiNoia then gave his views on *Evangelium Vitae* (1995), which deals with the sanctity of life. He analyzed the culture of death, which is concerned with the proliferation of abortion, euthanasia, and experimentation with human embryos. This anti-life ethos emerges from an individualism and materialism which hold a perverse view of freedom.

Next, Archbishop DiNoia discussed *Veritas Splendor* (1993), and reviewed the moral teachings of the Church in which the Pope responds to “an overall and systematic calling into question of traditional moral doctrine.” He asserted that what lies behind

this approach is the influence of trends of thought that detach faith from life and human freedom from its proper relationship to truth. He maintained that this runs counter to revelation and to the definitive teaching of the Church.

Finally, the Archbishop elaborated on *Fides et Ratio* (1998) which deals with the relationship between faith and reason (or, human reason enlightened by faith). In light of the current culture, Pope Saint John Paul II sought to illuminate the relationship between faith and reason and to confirm the power and credibility of revealed truth.

Throughout his talk, Archbishop DiNoia emphasized the theme of his presentation. As he pointed out, these four Encyclicals illustrated the differences between Christian Humanism and Secular Humanism.

A reception followed the lecture to celebrate the birthday of Pope Saint John Paul II (May 18) and the first anniversary of his canonization (April 27). Attendees had ample opportunity to meet Archbishop DiNoia and to ask additional questions about the work of this Great Pope. This also was a chance for everyone to meet and talk with others who shared in the admiration of Pope Saint John Paul II.

Reflections: 1965-2015



Bishop John J. Russell ordained me as a priest on May 1, 1965. He chose the first of May because it is the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker. Priests are laborers in the vineyard of Christ. For me, it became the state of Virginia, a part of the greater Washington metropolitan area. For forty years it has been an adventure in grace.

I have served in various parishes in the Arlington Diocese, in many aspects of pastoral ministry. I became a founding pastor, built two churches, a school and also a rectory. I have been active with youth groups at the parish and diocese C.Y.O. levels.

For the community, I have served as chaplain for the Civil Air Patrol and the Fairfax County Fire Service, Chaplain to the Knights of Columbus Councils, the Order of Alhambra Porto 102, and the Serra Club of Ft. Belvoir within the Arlington Diocese.

The high point in my priesthood is knowing Karol Wojtyła before he became our Holy Father. I had the pleasure of escorting him in Washington during his visits to the United States in 1969 and 1976. He once told me I have a "Polish Heart." The next day, God told me that I was in the presence of someone special. Later, he became Pope John Paul II. His gift to my priesthood is that I am one of the thousands of names he remembered and with whom he concelebrated Holy Mass many times as Pope.

My activity as "Duszpasterz Polski" (Polish Shepherd of Souls) within the metropolitan area has also enriched my priesthood. I remember well the first Pole I met in Virginia, Henry Rackowski, Jr., who introduced me to his family and relatives and, they in turn, to Polish National Alliance Lodge 848 of Washington, D.C. Thus began a Polish-American apostolate which this "Polish Heart," as Cardinal Wojtyła acknowledged, was able to share with the Washington and universal Polonia.

Cardinal Rubin came to our area in 1966 and we celebrated the Millennium of Polish Christianity. Cardinal Wojtyła came in 1969 and 1976 and through the years many other Polish priests and bishops. Together we have witnessed the birth of the Polish American Arts Association, Polish American Congress, and the Friends of John Paul II Foundation.

We saw the Polish Parish established in Silver Spring and the Pope John Paul II Cultural Center built. We have been guests at the Polish Embassy and attended many social functions during these years. We have prayed together with the Pope and attended some of his audiences.

Father Majka Celebrates 50th Anniversary

With gratitude to Almighty God, the Reverend Canon Philip S. Majka joyfully celebrated the Golden Jubilee of his ordination to the Holy Priesthood on Sunday, May 3rd, in St. Mark Catholic Church in Vienna, Virginia. Among the parishioners and friends present on this memorable occasion were members of Friends of John Paul II Foundation. The Mass was followed by a lively reception.

Father Majka was born in New Britain, Connecticut, on April 22, 1938, to Stanley A. Majka and Helen M. Kulas. The Majka family attended Holy Cross Church. Fr. Philip attended Israel Putnam and Washington Junior High Schools in New Britain; St. Thomas Seminary in Bloomfield, Connecticut; Queen of Apostles Seminary in Madison, Wisconsin; and SS. Cyril & Methodius Seminary in Orchard Lake, Michigan. He was ordained to the priesthood by the Most Rev. John J. Russell in Richmond, Virginia, on May 1, 1965. He celebrated his first Mass at Holy Cross Church on May 9th of that year.

Father Majka's assignments as Associate Pastor were in the northern Virginia area, in what is now the Diocese of Arlington. He served at Blessed Sacrament Church in Alexandria (1965-1967), St. Mark Church in Vienna (1967-1970), Good Shepherd Church, Mount Vernon (1970-1972), St. Michael Church, Annandale (1972-1975), and St. Mary Church, Old Town Alexandria (1975-1976).

In October 1976, Fr. Majka established the new parish of St. Elizabeth Seton, Lake Ridge, VA. He subsequently became the pastor of St. John the Evangelist Church in Warrenton, VA, in 1984 and the Pastor of St. Patrick Church in Fredericksburg, VA, in 1996.

Father Majka has served as Chaplain to the Knights of Columbus, the Serra Club, and the Fairfax County Fire Dept. He is a member of Polish-American organizations and has been Chaplain to the Polish Community in the Metropolitan Washington, D.C., area, including our Friends of John Paul II Foundation. He feels very blessed to have served as host twice to Cardinal Karol Wojtyła (later known as Pope John Paul II), in 1969 and 1976, during his visits to Washington, D.C. This led to a lifelong friendship and Fr. Majka said that he made it a point to visit Rome and the Holy Father at least once a year from 1978 until 2004.

Fr. Majka's awards and honors include the Cavalier's Cross of Merit from the President of Poland. He has been honored several times by the Friends of the John Paul II Foundation and the Polish American Congress. He received an award from the Polish American Priests Association and was designated Friend of the Order of the Pauline Fathers in Częstochowa, Poland. In 2001, he was made Canon of the Cathedral of the Holy Cross in Wrocław, Poland. Most recently, he received the Career Achievement Award from the American Council of Polish Culture in 2014.

Fr. Majka's last assignment was at St. James Parish in Falls Church, VA. Since July 2006, he has served as the Roman Catholic Chaplain at Dulles Airport. In 2010, he was elected vice-president of the National Conference of Catholic Airport Chaplains.

We thank Rev. Canon Philip Majka for his continuing spiritual guidance to the Friends of John Paul II Foundation and we thank God for his vocation to the priesthood.

SAINT JOHN PAUL II 2015 Legacy Art Contest

On January 15, 2015 our organization launched a new educational program to promote the legacy of Saint John Paul II to our young students. Our Educational Legacy Project chair, Cecilia Glembocki, assisted by Constance Donnelly, made available to the students, teachers and schools in the three area Diocesan Catholic schools the *Saint John Paul II 2015 Legacy Art Contest*. The contest was open to students in grades 6, 7, and 8 in the Catholic schools of the Dioceses of Washington, Baltimore and Arlington.

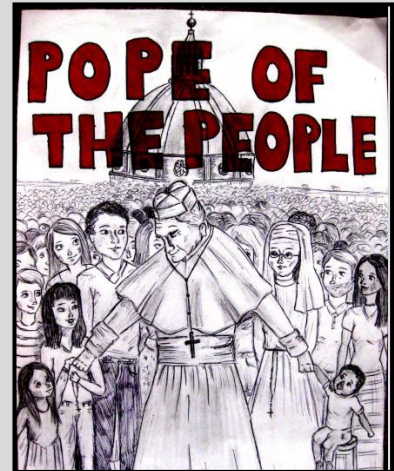

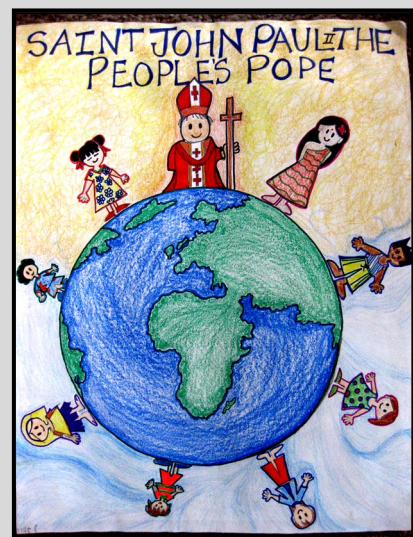

Pursuing New Ideas for the Summer of 2015

As we complete the final phase of the Saint John Paul II Legacy Art Contest for grades 6, 7, and 8 in the dioceses of Washington, Baltimore and Arlington, we will publicize the winners in the three diocesan newspapers as well as in our Chapter newsletter. We will certainly be able to share the wonderful ideas as a result of this art contest. Just from a few presentations that we have had, teachers and principals were very excited about their students winning the awards. During preparation for the contest, they all shared the enthusiasm that was present while learning about a saint who lived among us. Some teachers expressed an interest in the history of popes as we await the arrival of Pope Francis in the USA in September. Schools could easily use the book on 500 years of Papal Portraiture, that we placed in the media centers of many schools, to compare and contrast the accomplishments of various popes in history. What an interesting topic for teachers to pursue.

As we have completed our objectives in the educational legacy project for the past three years, we are now focusing our efforts in universities and colleges. Our beginning is the placement of a bronze bust of Saint John Paul II in the Columbus School of Law at The Catholic University of America. With the many universities and colleges in the greater Washington DC area, it is a starting point to bring together professors who may develop a course of studies about the teachings of John Paul II for their students.

Various proposals will be presented to the board in the fall for a discussion as to which plan would further the goals and directives of the Foundation.

While my husband and I were at the Dom Polski in Rome this past April, we met a young student working on a project in which he was translating the writings of Saint John Paul II from Polish into English. He is going to be visiting here in the USA in late June. Many new ideas may emerge from a coming meeting with him at the home of the Glembockis. All board members will be invited to speak with our young student who is doing his doctoral work in Rome.

It is an exciting time to work with educators. As we all know, teaching about John Paul II is only the beginning for young people to know A Saint Who Walked Among Us.

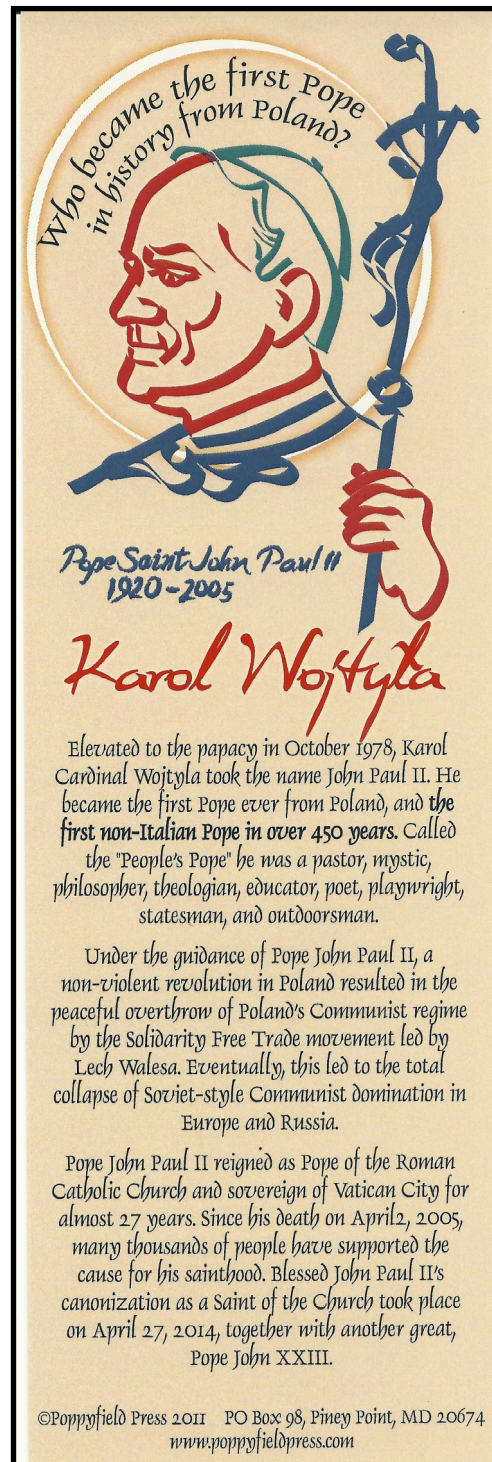

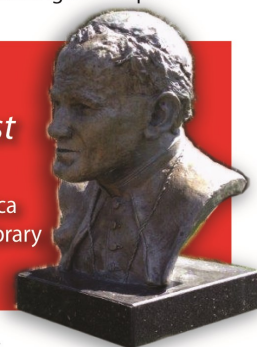
